

Juliet Sorensen is a Clinical Professor of Law at Northwestern University's Pritzker School of Law, where she is associated with its Center for International Human Rights. Professor Sorensen is the founder and director of the Northwestern Access to Health Project, a community-based, multidisciplinary partnership at the intersection of health, human rights, and development, and member of multiple American Bar Association initiatives including a liaison to the ABA's Task Force on Legal Needs Arising from the Coronavirus Pandemic.

Professor Sorensen is a cum laude graduate of Princeton University and the Columbia University School of Law, where she was a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar. In 2019, she was the recipient of the Walter J. Cummings Award for Pro Bono Service from the Federal Bar Association.
